Johnson Hall State Historic Site



Johnson Hall was the 1763 Georgian estate of Sir William Johnson and Molly Brant and their family.

Sir William (1715 - 1774) was the single largest landowner and most influential individual in the colonial Mohawk Valley.

His success in dealing with the Six Nations had a lasting impact on their relationship with the English, and largely influenced England's victory in the Anglo-French struggle for control of colonial North America.

The main house and flanking stonehouses, originally surrounded by a 700 acre farm, now interpret the Johnson family through guided tours of the period room settings, educational programs and special events.
